What is the Salubria Oktoberfest and History Faire?

This inaugural event will be held on the scenic grounds of Historic Salubria in Culpeper, marking the launch of Culpeper's 250th History Week as part of the county's 250th anniversary commemorations. This community-centered history celebration features reenactors and living history, traditional crafts, period music, local food and beverages, and hands-on activities for all ages. We anticipate upwards of 1,000 visitors in attendance throughout the day.

Who is organizing the event?

The Oktoberfest and History Faire is hosted by <u>Historic Germanna</u>, in partnership with Culpeper Tourism and Economic Development and the Virginia American Revolution 250 Commission (VA250). Where will the Oktoberfest and History Faire take place?

On the grounds of Historic Salubria in Culpeper—a preserved but unrestored 18th-century house that offers a rare, immersive glimpse into the past. The site offers ample space for demonstrations, performances, camps, and tours in a beautiful and historically significant setting.

Who are we inviting to participate?

We're looking for enthusiastic partners to help bring history to life:

- Historical organizations, regional non-profits, and museums to host interactive displays or tables
- Reenactors and living historians to set up camp or demonstrate historical lifeways
- Craftspeople to showcase traditional skills and techniques
- Folk and period musicians to perform throughout the day
- Food trucks to provide local flavor

What kinds of activities will there be?

- Guided tours of Salubria
- Reenactor camps and living history experiences
- Traditional crafts and demonstrations

- Food and beverage vendors
- Period and folk music performance
- Interactive history exhibits and activities

Logistics?

- There is no fee to participate
- Participants will need to bring their own tables, chairs, tents, etc.
- Water and Electric: There is one external water faucet available, and no usable electrical outlets
- Partners and staff will have access to a restroom and break area.
